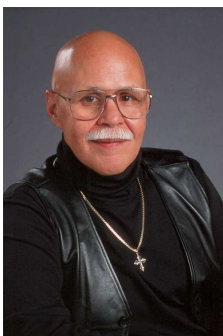

About the Speakers

Ted Peters, the 2009 Martin E. Marty Professor of Religion and the Academy at St. Olaf College, is a professor of systematic theology at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary and the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, California. He served as principal investigator of the Centre for Theology and the Natural Sciences research project funded by the NIH to study the "Theological and Ethical Questions Raised by the Human Genome Initiative."



Martinez Hewlett - Martinez Hewlett is an emeritus professor in the departments of Molecular and Cellular Biology and Medicine at the University of Arizona in Tucson, Arizona. He has published 30 scientific papers and a novel, *Divine Blood* (Ballantine 1994). He is a founding member and coordinator of the St. Albert the Great Forum on Theology and the Sciences at the University of Arizona. He serves as an adjunct professor at the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology at the GTU

Dr. Nancy R. Howell, is Academic Dean and Associate Professor of Theology and Philosophy of Religion at Saint Paul School of Theology. Nancy has served as co-chair of the Theology and Science Group of the American Academy of Religion and currently works with the Steering Committee of the Religion and Science to coordinate work on Buddhist-Christian dialogue on science and religion. Her research interests are concerned with the place of science-religion integrations within larger contexts of gender, race, class, and religious pluralism.



Dr Jacques Arnould is a Dominican priest. With a Ph.D. in History of Sciences and Ph. D. in Theology, he is the French Space Agency (CNES) expert in charge of ethical, social and cultural aspect of space activities. His research fields are life and its evolution and space and its conquest. The Académie Française has awarded him its 2004 La Bruyère Prize (silver medal), in the Literature & Philosophy category, for his book "The Devil's Whiskers" published by Editions du Cerf in 2003.
